BEAD Alternative Technology Applications will request information to support minimum BEAD eligibility requirements regarding financial and organizational capability and project plan information. Note: This is not a comprehensive list and additional information may be required.

Pr	oject Plan Information
	Project plan for each proposed project area, construction plan, including estimated project costs, project timeline, and relevant milestones for implementation of funded projects.
	Certification from Professional Engineer certifying that the project plan materials provided are reasonable and could be achieved within a four-year deployment timeline.
	Network design and diagram illustrating the logical network design and project area boundaries.
	Satellite design document detailing satellite network capabilities and plans.
	Certification detailing that the proposed project will deliver at least 5 Mbps of capacity (or 2 TBs of usage per month) to each BSL in the project area
	Commitments that applicant will offer low-cost plan and participate in any ACP successor program.
Sc	coring Criteria
	BEAD funding request and proposed match to be scored under Minimal BEAD Program Outlay.
	Price for a 100Mbps/20Mbps internet service plan that will be offered to all BEAD funded Broadband Service Locations (BSL) within the service area after deployment is completed.
	Fair labor practices documentation evidencing compliance with federal labor laws and forward-looking commitment to adhere to all state and federal fair labor laws.
	Speed to deployment commitment to provide service earlier than the four-year deadline.
	Speed of network and other technical capabilities, such as the useful life for the proposed infrastructure, certified and demonstrated
	Natural hazard narrative detailing how applicant will mitigate natural hazard risk in building and operating broadband infrastructure (plus additional narrative for projects with a high-risk Census Block Group (CBG).
	Letter of support from the municipal government (or Resolution of Consent or equivalent document from a Tribal government) from the jurisdiction that has the most BSLs within their proposed project area.
Fir	nancial Information
	Letter of credit or letter from a bank confirming the commitment to issuing an irrevocable standby letter of credit (ILOC) or bond. Alternatively, a <u>conditional programmatic waiver</u> if the subgrantee applicant does not obtain an ILOC.
	Template pro forma model that includes at a minimum estimated capital and operating expenditures (e.g., labor, materials, regulatory costs, etc.) and revenue from BEAD-deployed infrastructure in each proposed project area.
	Budget narrative that details critical assumptions and overall approach.
Or	ganizational and Managerial Information
	Legal opinion attesting to compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local labor and employment laws—as well as detailing any past violations or pending court proceedings.
	Resumes of key personnel, including financial, technical, and management personnel (if applicable).
	Notification plan narrative detailing how the applicant intends to notify relevant populations of the new or
